CUSD Maintains #1 Ranking in San Diego County

Second only to the hard work of our dedicated, outstanding teachers and administrators, the constant support and funding from Coronado Schools Foundation has made the most significant positive impact on our overall educational program and student progress. The STEAM-related and other enriching opportunities every Coronado Unified School District (CUSD) student has because CSF helps provide what education ought to be. Without CSF's donor direct financial support, education in Coronado would be very different.

CUSD is once again the highest performing unified school district (K-12) in San Diego County, based on Academic Performance Index (API) scores. Coronado students gained ground on other schools around the state by increasing scores on the API results taken from our STAR testing in May 2013. Each spring students take a formalized assessment (STAR) to examine their knowledge in various subjects. The District gained two points maintaining its title as the highest API score among unified districts in San Diego County. Coronado High School and Village Elementary remain among the top of San Diego County schools and in the top 10% of California schools, far exceeding the state benchmark of 800. In addition, Silver Strand Elementary and Coronado Middle School student achievement increased the overall school Academic Performance Index (API) score to 906 and 923, respectively, record levels for both schools.

School districts across California slipped by a fraction of a percentage point this year as schools dealt with ongoing budget reductions and the transition to the Common Core State Standards, State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson announced. The Graduation Rate for Coronado High School was an incredible 97.18 percent! This continues to be one of the highest in the county. Further data will be needed to see if the graduation rate remains the highest in the county.

On October 2, 2013, Governor Brown signed legislation changing the state's entire assessment and accountability systems. Superintendent Torlakson commented, "As valuable as STAR has been, we're getting ready to raise the bar in California's schools. This coming year, many students will have their first chance to try tests that measure their preparation for college and the world of work. That's a huge challenge for every part of our education system-but one we have to tackle to give every student the opportunity to prepare for a bright future." Coronado has been transitioning to the Common Core State Standards since 2011. Students will field test the new Smarter Balanced Assessment this coming spring, part of the new state Measures of Academic Performance and Progress (CalMAPP) system.

Engineering Pathway Bridges Math and Science

Intro to Engineering is part of the STEAM-(Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math) pathway within CUSD, offering engineering/robotics opportunities from elementary through high school. Now in its 3rd year at Coronado Middle School (CMS), students in Intro to Engineering have thus far been working on the concepts of structural engineering. As part of the project-based learning component of the class, after two weeks of construction and the use of over 8000 coffee sticks and a lot of glue, the students from the Intro to Engineering class at CMS completed 15 bridges, now on display at the CMS Library. "As an Algebra and Geometry teacher in addition to Intro to Engineering, I see firsthand how hands-on learning excites students at a young age," observed Mrs. Wertz. Engineering units are offered in elementary school science labs, and as a result, the engineering pathway at Coronado High School has grown from one to five classes, all due to CSF STEAM funding.

TRTs Impact Student Learning

Our Technology Resource Teacher (TRT) has greatly impacted student learning... She is a constant resource and model for innovative practices using technologies, learning management systems, and new applications in ways that truly transform student learning, rather than merely transposing experiences from paper to digital. She has come to me with a way to mirror desktop images with my tablet, which will allow me to travel throughout the room during lessons and to project items based on student needs, creating a more interactive, student driven experience. She has also shown us ways to make our Haiku webpages more engaging, using widgets that change on a daily bases, embedded videos, discussion boards, and quizzes that can be used as a way to guide students in choosing appropriately leveled activities and review assignments. Our TRT is invaluable!

Recently, I was asked for advice by a technology leader from another school district in San Diego County. He expressed that his biggest challenge is to use technology to transform the student learning experience. How do you encourage teachers use the devices available with their students? How do you ensure that the technology is used in a meaningful way? How do you avoid simply digitizing what has already been done on paper? Having devices, online textbooks, and learning management systems is great, but how can you make sure they are used to further personalize learning? Most of all, how do you do this at the site level where it directly impacts student learning?

The TRTs successfully manage pilot studies of learning software across the district, ensuring that every program purchased for student use meets the district standards for functionality, curricular content, and student engagement. TRTs assist teachers in the use of MAP and Compass Learning, products that assess each student's specific skills and provide personalized practice activities based on individual student needs.

Additional support includes:

- Whole class instruction on using Web 2.0 applications, and various software programs
- Supporting technology integration, maintenance, and improvement
- Classroom integration of iPads, netbooks, docu-cams, ENO Boards, and other tools
- Planning of teacher trainings to use and integrate technology tools with classroom curriculum and the new Common Core Standards
- One on one training and support for students, teachers, staff, and parents in the use of district programs such as Haiku, Synergy, MAP, Compass Learning, and other learning programs
- Lesson development to include multimedia tools
- Continual research on current best practices in the use of technology and digital content
